



James L. McIntire

Now serving his second term as state Treasurer, James McIntire is the only statewide elected official to serve on the Washington State Investment Board. McIntire is one of the three ex-officio voting members who serve on the Board.

From 2011 to 2014, McIntire was State Investment Board Chair. Currently, he chairs the WSIB's Audit Committee and is a member of the Private Markets and Administrative committees.

Previously, McIntire was a successful business economist for Navigant Consulting, Inc.; served five terms as a state representative for the Seattle area; worked for U.S. Senator Hubert Humphrey; and, was a policy advisor to congressional committee chairmen and Washington governors.

As a state legislator, McIntire served on several financial committees and sponsored laws to make identity theft a crime; create a constitutionally protected "Rainy Day Account;" require performance audits for state agencies; and, establish the Citizen Commission for Performance Measurement of Tax Preferences.

In his role as state Treasurer, McIntire's focus is to protect the safety and security of public funds, the integration of sound financial management throughout state government, and the need for long term financial planning to meet Washington's education and transportation needs.

McIntire earned his PhD in economics at the University of Washington, where he founded a directed a fiscal policy center and taught economics for 25 years.
